## Incidents

In the month of May alone, the Maynard Police Department and Maynard Fire Department have responded to **four** overdose calls.

Maynard High School students reported finding sharps in a wooded area by the school, they were removed and the matter is being investigated by Detective Sweeney and the Maynard School Department.

On May 14<sup>th</sup> at approximately 3:38 PM, the Maynard Police Department responded to assist the Maynard Fire Department with a fire inside of the China Ruby Restaurant. The restaurant was evacuated, and the fire was extinguished.



## Community Outreach

On May 11<sup>th</sup>, the Maynard Police Department participated in a mock drunk driving accident set up by the Maynard Fire Department. There were participants from Maynard High School, Pro EMS and the Fowler Kennedy Funeral Home on scene as well. This is an impactful presentation, used to remind students of the dangers of drugged and drunk driving. We are happy to report there were no incidents on Prom Night.

On May 19<sup>th</sup>, the Maynard Police Department and Maynard Fire Department participated in their second "High Five Friday" at the Green Meadow School. The students seem to enjoy it (and the Officers too!). We feel it's an excellent way to build positive relationships with the children in the community. There is one more "High Five Friday" planned for the last day of school, June 19<sup>th</sup>!

We have had two students from the Maynard High School observe Public Safety Communications and observe Police Officers in their daily Patrol routines, as a part of their senior projects. We are happy to give them a glimpse into what we do here on a regular basis,

We received a request from a resident, whose husband is in the Massachusetts Army National Guard and a Massachusetts State Trooper to collect items needed for members of the Massachusetts Army National Guard. We happily placed a collection bin in our lobby, and received a good amount of donations. We hope to continue this as needed.
