The Officers noticed the vehicle had been queried several times by another Police Department. Dispatch contacted the Police Department and it was discovered that this female had left a family member behind at a grocery store and was being sought after to check her well being. ## Training

On September 14<sup>th</sup>, the new Next Gen E911 was deployed in Maynard. All Police Officers and Dispatchers that hold E911 certifications were trained on the new system. There was a representative from State 911 on hand, who was able to review the training with Dispatchers on the day the new system was implemented.

On September 20<sup>th</sup>, there was a NEMLEC SWAT training at Mill and Main Place that Sergeant Duggan was able to coordinate.

On September 20<sup>th</sup> and 21<sup>st</sup> the Maynard Police Department hosted Lights, Sights and Lasers at the Maynard Rod and Gun Club. Detective Sweeney, Officer Brennan and Officer Manchuso attended the training along with members of Police Departments from surrounding cities, towns and states.

Detective Bodwell attended a firearms update course on September 27<sup>th</sup> at the Marlborough Police Department.

Ofc. Manchuso attended a week long training in Dover New Hampshire. The Basic Crisis Negotiation Course was taught by the FBI Critical Incident Response Group, Crisis Negotiation Unit.

Officer Maskalenko has completed his field training, and will now be on patrol.
