## Incidents

On June 6<sup>th</sup>, Officer Houle investigated a report of illegal dumping at Foley and Son's on Main Street.

A report of received on June 6<sup>th</sup> of damage to a telephone pole on Dix Road during the day shift. Officer Comeau, on the evening shift, responded to a report of a vehicle parked illegally, covered in a tarp. Through Officer Comeau's investigation he was able to determine the illegally parked vehicle was likely the one involved in the hit and run accident. The individual involved was summonsed to Concord District Court.

Officer Brennan responded to Maple Street for a report of a vehicle that struck a parked car. Upon arrival, Officer Brennan requested the Maynard Fire Department for an evaluation of the operator. He was evaluated and refused treatment. Officer Brennan began to photograph the damage to the vehicle, and observed drug paraphernalia. The operators backpack was searched, and baggies containing small amounts of white powdery substance were found. This individual was summonsed for possession of class B, failure to keep right and negligent operation of a motor vehicle.

On June 8<sup>th</sup>, Officers Maskalanko and Moore responded to the Maynard Fine Arts Theater for a report of stolen movie posters. The manager provided access to the video recordings, and Officers observed a female removing the posters from the wall. The individual was known to these Officers, and she was issued a summons for Larceny Over\$1200.00.

On June 13<sup>th</sup>, while assigned to patrol Officer Sutherland detected a strong odor of raw sewage covering a large area in Main Street. A pedestrian flagged down Officer Sutherland and informed him that a semi-trailer was leaking sewage into the roadway. Officer Sutherland was able to locate the vehicle and speak with the operator. The area in which the semi-trailer traveled was provided by the operator, and the appropriate agencies were notified in regards to clean up.



## Community Outreach

On June 10<sup>th</sup>, Officer Manchuso and Officer Brennan participated in the 2018 Cruiser Convoy for the Special Olympics. There were approximately 215 cruisers from around the Commonwealth. Thank you to Officer Manchuso and Officer Brennan for representing the Maynard Police Department.
