Incidents

On July 1st, 2024, Officer Riviere responded to Saint Bridget's Cemetery for a report of a storage shed that was broken into. Management discovered that the storage shed had been broken into, and equipment had been stolen. The incident is under investigation.

On July 3rd, 2024, Sergeant Petersen took a report of a scam. An individual contacted her stating that her computer was infected with a virus, and they needed to rectify the issue. She was instructed to withdraw money from her account. She realized it was a scam and reported the phone call. She was advised to contact her banking institution and monitor accounts.

On July 3rd, 2024, Officer Oliveira took a report of a hit and run accident that occurred on Naylor Court. The reporting party witnessed a small motorcycle lose control and hit a vehicle parked in the lot. The incident was documented, and Officers canvassed for camera footage.

On July 12th, 2024, Officer Gennaro took a report of an online scam. An individual on Facebook marketplace had listed a property for rent in Maynard. An interested party conversed online with the alleged property owner, and went to view the property discovering it was not for rent and was a scam. The incident was documented and is under investigation.

On July 22nd, 2024, Officer Blackington took a report of suspicious activity. A resident reported that she recently noticed damage to her apartment door consistent with someone attempting to gain entry. The damage was documented, and the resident was advised of steps to take for better security.

On July 29th, 2024, Officer Blackington responded to Digital Way for a report of a hit and run motor vehicle accident. The owner of the vehicle reported that her vehicle was damaged while she was shopping. The damage was documented, and the area canvassed for cameras.

On July 30th, 2024, Officer Blackington took a report of vandalism to a motor vehicle. The owner of the vehicle reported that it appeared as though someone had damaged her vehicle on purpose. The incident was documented.

Canine Tracking School

Detective McCann and K9 Otis successfully completed a 5 week tracking school held in Middleborough at Professional Canine Services. Otis will assist with searches for missing kids, individuals with autism, those suffering from dementia and/or Alzheimer's, lost hikers and individuals who may have wandered away from assisted living facilities, or any search for non-violent/non-criminal persons.

This training will be of great service to our community and surrounding communities in times of need. Thank you Professional Canine Services for providing this potentially life saving skillset to Detective McCann and K9 Otis.



Community Outreach

The Maynard Fire Department held a cooling center at 30 Sudbury Street from 8:00AM-8:00PM during an exceptionally hot week in Maynard, the center was open to all.

Notice of Roadway - Intersection Construction Concord Street at Route 27 I.W. Harding Construction Co. Inc. will be performing roadway, sidewalk, and traffic signal construction at the intersection of Concord Street and Acton Street/Haynes Street beginning on or around August 12, 2024, and running through the Winter of 2024, weather permitting. The work consists of construction of a new traffic signal, pedestrian signals, roadway milling, pavement overlay, sidewalk reconstruction, curbing, pedestrian curb ramps, signage, pavement markings, and pedestrian crossing equipment. Once construction is started, no on-street parking will be allowed until all construction activities are completed. Daily vehicular, pedestrian, and bicycle traffic detours may be put into place to facilitate the contractor's construction of the roadway and traffic signal improvements. Please plan on potential delays or to seek alternate travel routes during times when detours are in place.
