Incidents

On November 1st, 2024 Officer Wellborn responded to the intersection of Acton Street and Main Street. The “keep right” sign appeared to have been struck by a motor vehicle. The incident was documented and photographed, and DPW was notified.

On November 5th, 2024 Officers responded to a report of two individuals that appeared to have exchanged a firearm in a parking lot. After investigating the incident, it was discovered that it was an airsoft gun that was being moved from one vehicle to another by father and son.

On November 6th, 2024 Officer Muraguri and Officer Noonan responded to the Mill and Main Place Parking Lot for a report of a group of youths throwing rocks at a couple walking in the lot. The incident was documented and the area was canvassed for camera footage.

On November 7th, 2024 Officer Noonan took a report of theft from funds on an EBT card totaling \$800.00. The individual filed a report and Officer Noonan contacted the EBT hotline.

On November 9th, 2024 Officer Blackington took a report of a theft from Excelsior Comics and Games. The suspect has been identified a request for an arrest warrant was issued.

On November 10th, 2024 Officer Noonan took a report of an ATV that had been stolen out of a vacant house/garage. The house was photographed, and the incident was documented.

On November 15th, 2024 Officers responded to a report of a motor vehicle accident, car versus pedestrian. The individual that was struck was transported to the hospital for an evaluation and a citation was issued.

On November 15th, 2024 Officer Houle took a report from a U-Haul Field Manager about a vehicle that was not returned. Officer Houle was able to make contact with the individual who rented the vehicle and arrange to have it immediately returned.

On November 17th 2024, Officers responded to the Corner Store for a burglary alarm, upon arrival damage to the door was discovered. Items were taken from the store, and surveillance footage was obtained. The matter is under investigation.

On November 19th, 2024, Officer Wellborn responded to Planet Fitness for a report of ammunition located inside the locker room. The ammunition was taken, and the incident was documented.

On November 21st, 2024, an individual reported that he was assaulted outside of CVS in the parking lot. The individual was evaluated by the Maynard Fire Department, the incident was documented and the matter is under investigation.

On November 29th, Officers responded to Magnoila for a report of a disturbance outside of the restaurant. No trespass orders were issued to two individuals, and the incident is under investigation.

Community Outreach

The Maynard Police Department began collecting names for their annual Toy Drive. Sign up will end on December 9th, 2024.

November 14th was National Seat Belt Day, which reminds people of the importance of buckling up when riding in or driving a vehicle. Seat belts are easy to take for granted, but they make a massive difference in the event of a motor vehicle crash. According to the National Highway Traffic Safety Administration, properly wearing a seat belt in the front seat can reduce fatalities in the event of a crash by 45% and prevent moderate-to-critical injuries by 50%.

The statewide outdoor fire ban was lifted on November 26th, 2024 after a record number of brush fires in Massachusetts.

The Maynard Police Department is participating in a coat drive, there is a box in our lobby to accept donations until December 31st, 2024.
