Incidents

On January 3rd, 2025, Officer Houle took a report from a resident who stated that she made payment for services rendered through a link which turned out to be fraudulent. The incident was documented.

On January 8th, 2025, Officer Gennaro responded to a Main Street restaurant for a report of an individual who they would like removed from the business. The individual was issued a no trespass order.

On January 10th, 2025, Officers responded to Powder Mill Road for a report of a structure fire. Officers assisted the Maynard Fire Department on scene, and Detective Avril responded to assist with the investigation.

On January 11th, 2025, Officers responded to Glenwood Cemetery for a report of a B&E to a Motor Vehicle, and a purse was missing. The incident was documented, the vehicle was photographed and area canvassed for cameras. The incident is under investigation.

On January 12th, 2025, the Maynard Police and Fire Departments responded to a report of an individual struck in the crosswalk Parker Street @ Walnut Street. The individual was transported to the hospital for evaluation and the incident was documented. There has been traffic enforcement in the area.

On January 18th, 2025, Officer Wellborn responded to a residence with the Maynard Fire Department for a report of smoke coming from the basement. Officers noted an electrical burning smell coming from the residence. The Maynard Fire Department located a small fire on a stove, and it was extinguished.

On January 29th, 2025, Officer Muraguri responded with the Maynard Fire Department to Fairfield Street for a report of a tree that fell on a residence. The Maynard Fire Department noted no issues other than damage at the time. The owner of the residence was notified, the incident was documented.
