#### **Incidents**

On January 3<sup>rd</sup>, 2025, Officer Houle took a report from a resident who stated that she made payment for services rendered through a link which turned out to be fraudulent. The incident was documented.

On January 10<sup>th</sup>, 2025, Officers responded to Powder Mill Road for a report of a structure fire. Officers assisted the Maynard Fire Department on scene, and Detective Avril responded to assist with the investigation.

On January 11<sup>th</sup>, 2025, Officers responded to Glenwood Cemetery for a report of a B&E to a Motor Vehicle, and a purse was missing. The incident was documented, the vehicle was photographed and area canvassed for cameras. The incident is under investigation.
