Incidents

On April 2nd, 2025 Officer Gennaro spoke with a resident in the lobby who stated that someone came to the residence asking for someone that did not reside there. Ofc. Gennaro was able to ascertain it was a Constable looking for a prior resident.

On April 3rd, 2025 Officer Oliveira spoke with an individual who reported their debit card had been stolen from Planet Fitness. It was discovered there had been three unauthorized purchases with the card. The incident is under investigation.

On April 3rd, 2025 Officer Gennaro took a report from CVS for a known scam, an individual attempted to pay for \$700.00 of items using digital payment, which was declined. A card number is then provided verbally. The cashier did not accept the payment and notified the Police Department.

On April 6th, 2025 Officer Oliveira took a report of identify fraud. A resident reported that her information was used to file a fraudulent tax return. The incident was documented.

On April 9th, 2025 Officer Houle took a report of a Venmo scam. A resident submitted two payments to someone selling a motor vehicle through Facebook. The Facebook post turned out to be fraudulent and the individuals account had been hacked, providing an alternate Venmo handle. The incident was documented.

On April 18th, 2025 Ofc. Blackington took a report of a vehicle that was damage by an exposed drainage cover on Summer Street. The incident was documented and the damage was photographed.

On April 20th, 2025 Officers responded to an unoccupied residence for a report of flashlights being seen in and around the residence. Officers located two juveniles who stated they had been exploring the house. They were advised and parents were contacted.

On April 21st, 2025 Sergeant Wellborn took a report of ammunition that was located as a residence was being cleaned out. The items were taken for safekeeping and it was documented.
