Incidents

On September 1st, 2025 Officer Banatoski responded to Camellia Gardens for a report of stolen money and credit cards. The incident was documented and the resident was advised.

On September 1st, 2025 Officer Seeley took a report of vandalism at Mill and Main Place. The graffiti was photographed and the incident was documented.

On September 1st, 2025 Officer Seeley responded with the Maynard Fire Department for a report of smoke and flames coming out of a dumpster. The Fire Department extinguished the fire and determined it was likely caused by an improperly disposed of cigarette.

On September 12th, 2025 the shift responded to a report of a motor vehicle accident with a vehicle rollover. The operators were transported to the hospital and the incident was documented.

On September 15th, 2025 Officer Seeley took a report of an individual that went into CVS and removed approximately \$880.00 of products without making payment. It was reported to loss prevention and the incident was documented.

On September 15th, 2025 Officer Muraguri took a report of livestock remains that had been dumped into a dumpster at the Maynard Rod and Gun Club. The camera footage was reviewed and the incident was documented.

On September 16th, 2025 Officer Tully responded to report of paint that appeared to have been poured down the storm drain. The incident was documented and the drain was photographed.

On September 18th, 2025 Detective Avril responded to The Paper Store for a theft of Stanley cups. The incident remains under investigation.

On September 22nd, 2025 Detective Avril responded to Main Street for a report of a car versus bicyclist. The bicycle and vehicle sustained no visible damage and there were no injuries reported.

On September 24th, 2025 Sergeant Wellborn took a report of a handicap placard that may have been stolen from a vehicle while parked at Market Basket. The incident was documented and the owner was advised.

On September 28th, 2025 Officer Blackington took a report of a vehicle that was stolen during the overnight hours. The vehicle was recovered in Worcester.
