# Incidents

The Maynard Police Department has received upwards of 40 reports of unemployment fraud. We encourage you to file a report with the Police Department if you receive correspondence to your residence or from an employer stating that someone has filed for unemployment using your information.

On October 7<sup>th</sup>, 2020 the Maynard Police Department and Fire Department responded to numerous calls related to trees/wires down during a storm. In addition to those calls, they responded to a 2-alarm fire on Orchard Terrace. There were no injuries as a result of the fire.

On October 10<sup>th</sup>, 2020 Officers responded to 7-Eleven to speak with a about a customer that caused a disturbance after they were unable to produce ID to purchase a scratch ticket. The customer left the store prior to arrival, and the incident was documented.

On October 15<sup>th</sup>, 2020 Officers responded to a parking complaint on Deane Street. The registration was run through NCIC and was reported as stolen out of UHAUL in Natick Massachusetts. The vehicle was recovered and returned to the UHAUL facility.

On October 20<sup>th</sup>, 2020 Officers located a backpack containing marijuana. The backpack was photographed and logged as evidence.

On October 23<sup>rd</sup>, 2020 a resident reported what appeared to be new damage to 12 Bancroft Street, the Coolidge School. The damage was documents, and the Assistant Facilities Manager was notified.

On Wednesday October 21, 2020 our officers received a report of a missing 17-year-old female. Through our investigation working with several other agencies we located the juvenile female the following day. She is safe, the family has been notified and we are currently working with them to provide further assistance or services they may require. Due to this being a family matter involving a juvenile we will not be providing any further information. We would like to thank all of those in the community who reached out to offer their assistance.
