The Maynard Police Department was saddened to share the passing of former Maynard Police Officer John "Gitzy" Kaziukonis in December. Officer Kaziukonis retired in 2004, after 26 dedicated years at the Maynard Police Department.

On December 25th, 2020 the Maynard Police and Fire Departments responded to a structure fire on Durant Avenue. The fire was extinguished, and there were no reported injuries.

There were 10 new reports of unemployment fraud in the month of December.

On December 5th. 2020 Ofc. King responded to a residence on Douglas Avenue during a storm and assisted a vehicle that was stuck on the lawn of a residence.
