It was brought to our attention that there has been an ongoing issue of items being left on the side of the road specifically in the area of Parker St at Old Marlboro Rd (FEMA side) Please dispose of items properly and refrain from leaving them on the side of the road.

On May 5th, the Maynard Post Office reported that an arrow had been shot through a window of their building. A makeshift target was in the alleyway behind the Post Office. Officers had previously spoken to an individual shooting a bow and arrow at that location. He was spoken to and advised. The individual resolved the matter with the Post Office.

On May 6th, Officers responded to a report of illegal dumping on Dawn Road. Officers were able to determine the individual that left the trash, and he was advised.

On May $11^{\rm th}$, Officers responded to Summer Hill Glen for a report of an Amazon package that was stolen. The reporting party contacted Amazon, and a replacement was sent.

On May 16^{th} , an Officer and the ACO responded to a report of a dog that attacked their dog and subsequently bit the owner. The ACO placed the dog under a 10-day quarantine and the incident was documented.

On May 20th, Mill and Main Security reported recent graffiti in the parking garage, the graffiti may have occurred during the hours of 3:00AM – 11:00AM. The incident was documented.

On May 25th, Officers responded to a medical emergency related to a juvenile being struck by a motor vehicle while riding a bicycle. Approximately 30 minutes prior while crossing the street on a bicycle he was struck by a vehicle causing him to flip over his handlebar. The driver stopped and asked if he was okay, to which he replied yes. The juvenile was examined by MFD, and a waiver was obtained. Officers obtained video of the incident from a nearby residence. The matter is under investigation.
