On Thursday September 2nd, 2021, the Maynard Police and Fire Department responded to Park Street for a fatal two-alarm fire. Public Safety Communications received a report of an odor of natural gas, and of an explosion were received subsequently.

A motor vehicle accident caused significant damage to a fire hydrant on Sarah Lane. The accident resulted in low water pressure and discolored water in some areas.

The Maynard Police and Fire Departments have continued to respond to reports of an odor of natural gas. These agencies are working alongside Eversource to be sure that each instance is investigated.
