On July $7^{\text {th }}$, the DPW reported that the gas line to one of their vehicles had been cut, and the diesel fuel had been taken out. The incident was photographed and documented. Extra checks of the area are being conducted.

On July $7^{\text {th }}$, Ofc. McCann received a report of vandalism at the vehicle charging station on Naylor Court. Ofc. McCann documented the vandalism and will follow up with Maynard Public Schools.
