Incidents

On March 9th, 2023, a resident reported that she was notified by her church that checks had been stolen from the mailbox including one that she had written. Ofc. Morahan spoke with the resident, and the banking institutions. The incident was documented and under investigation.

On March 20th, 2023, MPD and MFD responded to Parker Street for a motor vehicle versus pedestrian accident. The operator of the vehicle and the pedestrian were transported to the hospital.

On March 22nd, 2023, a resident reported that her vehicle had been broken into on Main Street. Several items of value were stolen from the vehicle. A fingerprint was obtained from the door of the vehicle, and the matter is under investigation.

On March 28th, a local company stated that they had shipped nearly \$85,000.00 of product on a trial basis to a party out of state. The products were not returned, and it appears as though a stolen identity was used to obtain these products. The incident is under investigation.

On March 22nd, Maynard Public Safety Communications received nearly twenty 911 calls reporting a structure fire at 14 Powder Mill Circle.
