There has been another uptick in unemployment fraud reports, if you are a victim of fraud, please report it to the Police Department

On Sunday May 7th, 2023, Officers responded to Powder Mill Road for a report of a vehicle on fire, there was no one inside of the vehicle. The Fire Department arrived and was able to put the fire out. Fire Investigators are investigating the cause.

On May 8th, 2023, Officers responded to Excelsior Comics and Games for a report of Pokemon cards that had been stolen were sold back to an employee. Officers spoke with those involved, money as returned to the store and the matter was forwarded to SRO McCann.

On May 11th, 2023, Officers responded to Market Basket for a report of a shopper changing the prices on items within the store. The individual was escorted from the store and issued a no trespass order.

On May 12th, 2023, Officers responded to the Maynard Lodge of Elks for a report of a purse that was stolen from a motor vehicle in the parking lot. Several items from the handbag were discovered to have been discarded. The reporting party was advised to report the theft to her bank, monitor credit, and a report was filed.

On May 16th, 2023, Officers responded to Digital Way for a report of a construction vehicle that was vandalized. The windows had been broken, and damage was estimated to be \$1,000. The damage was photographed, and incident was documented.

On May 18th, 2023, Officers responded to a report of a past breaking and entering. A cashiers check and several watches had been taken. The scene was photographed, and the incident is under investigation.

On May 26th, 2023, Officers responded to the area of 6 Louise Street for a report of a garbage truck that took down wires. The wires were identified as Verizon cable wires. They were reported to the utility company.

On May 26th, 2023, Officers responded to a report of graffiti written on signs along the side of the building near the walkway. The glass will cost \$150.00 per sign to replace. Officers are looking for camera footage in the area.
