STATEMENT OF CHIEF NOBLE REGARDING MISSING CHILD

At 1:13pm on July 19, 2023, Maynard Police Dispatch received a 911 call regarding a missing four (4) year old girl. All town units responded and began to search for the child. K9 units and drones were called in to assist the search. As more time went by without locating her, we called in additional support including the Massachusetts State Police Airwing. We also requested information from the community using social media and a reverse 911 call. Mercifully at 2:35pm she was located in a thick bush near her home.

I would like to extend my personal thanks to the NEMLEC K9 and associated units, Maynard Fire Department, Maynard DPW, Sudbury Police Department, Concord Police Department, Stow Police Department, and the Massachusetts State Police Airwing for their quick response and assistance. A special thanks to Chief Scott Nix of Sudbury for responding and assisting with the coordination of personnel during the search.

I would also like to recognize the members of the Maynard Police Department. Several officers came in off-duty and all on-duty personnel were involved in the search. The Dispatchers were tremendous in their management of all incoming requests and notifications during a high stress incident. This outlines the dedication of the Maynard Police Department to their community. Finally, I want to thank the public; so many from the neighborhood and Town came to assist in the search and it is great to see our community rally to help someone in need. I am proud to serve as Chief of Police in the Town of Maynard.

On July 2nd, Officers responded to a report of a disturbance at McDonald's. A male party was unhappy with the customer service. He was asked to leave the store, and issued a no trespass order.

On July 3rd, Ofc. Gates responded to Demars Street for a report of a tree that feel onto a house. The tree did not appear to cause any damage to the residence, the incident was documented.

On July 7th, Ofc. Muraguri received a report of illegal dumping on White Avenue. The reporting party stated that debris was being dumped on town land. The incident was documented and DPW was notified.

On July 10th, the on duty shift was dispatched to a motor vehicle versus pedestrian accident Concord Street at Haynes Street. A party was struck while crossing the road. The individual was transported to the hospital with injuries. The operator was issued a summons to appear in court.

On July 17th, Ofc. Muraguri received a report from a resident that two credit cards had been opened using his information. The incident was documented, and he was assisted in reporting the incident to his bank. The incident was documented.
