On September 11th, 2023 we proudly stood alongside members of the Maynard Fire Department as we came together to pay tribute to those who lost their lives on September 11th. We shall never forget.

Incidents

On September 2nd, Ofc. Davoll responded to a report of a package that was opened, and a gift card was stolen from inside. The matter is under investigation.

On September 7th, 2023 Ofc. Seeley took a report of property damage to the outdoor seating area at Azucar Tapas Bar. The area was checked for cameras, however, non were located with a clear view.. The incident was documented.

On September 10th, 2023 Maynard Police Department peacefully de-escalated a standoff involving a man barricaded inside a home on Elm Court on Sunday. At about 12:29 p.m., Maynard Police were called to a house at 7 Elm Court on a report that a 20-year-old male was destroying objects and was armed with a hatchet. Other occupants exited the home safely. The male then barricaded himself inside. Officers arrived on scene and called for Special Weapons and Tactics (SWAT) support, and crisis negotiator Sgt. Manchuso. Sgt. Manchuso helped to bring the subject out of the house, allowing officers to take the subject into custody. Maynard Police, with the assistance of Sgt. Manchuso, and the mutual aid support of the Northeast Massachusetts Law Enforcement Council (NEMLEC), Acton Police, and Stow Police, were able to bring the situation to a peaceful conclusion at about 2:03 p.m.

On September 12th, Ofc. Houle responded to the Deer Path Condo complex for a tree that fell causing significant damage to three vehicles. The incident was photographed and documented.

On September 21st, 2023, all units responded to Main Street for a report of a motor vehicle accident, car versus pedestrian. The pedestrians that were struck were transported to the hospital with non-life-threatening injuries. The accident scene was photographed, and the incident was documented.

On September 24th, 2023, a homeowner on Waltham Street reported finding a red stain on their garage door. Security camera footage was reviewed in the area and it appeared as though a juvenile had thrown a fake blood-like substance at the residence. The incident was documented.

The Maynard Police and Fire Departments responded to many reports of damage, due to severe weather, several streets were impassable as power lines and trees were down. Roughly 17 streets were impacted by severe weather, including heavy rain and high winds, in what is believed to be a microburst. Roads were cleared, with assistance from the Maynard Department of Public Works, and Eversource. There were no reported injuries, but there was damage to several properties.

Community Outreach

The Maynard Police and Fire Departments hosted the “Until Help Arrives” training with an instructor from MEMA. We had an excellent turnout, thank you to those who attended.

September 17th-23rd is recognized by the National Highway Traffic Safety Administration (NHTSA) as Child Passenger Safety Week. According to the NHTSA, vehicle crashes are among the leading causes of death for children: 710 children under the age of 13 were killed in crashes while riding in passenger vehicles in 2021, and more than 100,000 were injured. More than a third (36%) of those children who died were unrestrained. All parents are encouraged to have their child’s car seat inspected by a professional. Saturday, Sept. 23, was National Seat Check Saturday.
